The Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) team can show you ways of gathering feedback from students using a range of technologies, both online and in the classroom. They can also share techniques and good practice to help you plan and undertake this successfully.

Evaluating your use of Technology Enhanced Learning

The Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) team can support you in evaluating the impact of your use of technology on your students' learning experience, including writing questions for use in surveys and focus groups. The team can also explain what data is available about your students' interaction with the online courses, activities and resources that you provide through systems such as Blackboard.

The Quality Assurance and Policy (QAP) team are able to assist with questions related to T&L policy and module/programme evaluation. The QAP team can also help with cyclical review activities including Periodic Evaluation and Enhancement Review, Portfolio Management Process, and Annual Review of Collaborative Provision. All of these activities should help staff to engage in critical reflection about their teaching and learning activities, based on key dataset and qualitative feedback. Colleagues will also be happy to discuss any issues around the programme approval and amendment processes, accreditation of activities, and the creation of new teaching partnerships.
