

The University of Reading Fairtrade Annual Report and Action Plan

2022/2023 Progress Report

i. Introduction

This report provides information on the activity carried out during 2022/23 by the University of Reading as part of the Fairtrade University & College Award re-accreditation, to promote Fairtrade, trade justice and ethical consumption values at the University and as part of our wider Responsible Procurement efforts.

The sections below provide updates on our aims, recent activity and progress, our SMART Action Plan and our plans for the future.

ii. Aims

The University of Reading, along with our partners the University Anglican Chaplain, the Reading University Student Union (RUSU) and onsite retailer Co-op, are proud to have been committed to Fairtrade accreditation since 2011. The University is now working on the Fairtrade Foundation University & College Award re-accreditation for 2023.

Our aim is to deliver against the objectives set out in the Fairtrade Foundation's University & Colleges Award accreditation process. We have been working to ensure that we consistently engage with our students, professional and academic staff and the wider community. We aim to ensure Fairtrade is an issue that the University and its partners focus on throughout the year.

iii. 2022/23 Progress Update

Membership & Meetings

The University continues to hold Fairtrade Steering Group meetings at least twice a year to plan and review progress on activities related to Fairtrade, trade justice and ethical consumption.

Activities

Over the last year a number of excellent activities have been carried out by members of the University and our partners which contribute to our aims including:

Inclusion of topics related to Fairtrade, trade justice and ethical consumption in <u>Academic</u> research, teaching and publications.



- > Taking a leading role in the <u>Reading Community Action Network</u> and Citizens Alliance.
- Commitment to <u>Net Zero by 2030</u>.
- > Development of a University-wide <u>Sustainability Strategy</u>.
- Partnering for the Planet Climate Education initiative has also put in place staff Climate Ambassadors, Climate education for teachers, Climate Education Action Plan and Information for schools to encourage positive outcomes alongside the principles of Fairtrade
- ➢ Incorporation of Education for Sustainable Development into all degree programmes.
- ▶ Launch of the <u>Teaching Climate and Sustainability in Primary Schools</u> free online course.
- Integration of the UN Sustainable Development Goals into the University's Sustainability Strategy and Responsible Procurement activity log.
- First <u>RUSU Student Sustainability Summit</u> held in March 2023.
- > Amazing initiatives by our Campus Commerce Catering team such as:
 - Development of the <u>Sustainable Food Policy And Framework</u> which is 100% in line with Fairtrade, trade justice and ethical consumption philosophies.
 - The launch of hydration stations across campus
 - The <u>FlavUoR Garden</u> on campus to grow our own herbs, plants, and ingredients and educate our students, staff and guests on what goes into our delicious meals.
 - Committed to consistent improvement around sustainable catering in a manner that is financially sustainable to allow us to continue to invest in this area. We appreciate and understand that different individuals and groups have different interpretations and views on how to achieve this, so we try to be open and transparent on our progress, to encourage conversation and debate. All our physical outlets have been independently audited and certified through the Sustainable Restaurant Association's Food Made Good scheme awarding us the maximum of three stars.
 - Since our single use cup tax increased to 50p in September 2022, the percentage of hot drinks served in reusable cups has increased from 20% to 60%. This has reduced the number of single use cups used on campus during the first term by approx. 55,000.
- Coordination between our Fairtrade re-accreditation and the Student <u>Red Award, Red Global</u> <u>Action Award and Red Sustainable Action Award</u>
- Fairtrade Fortnight & additional events held by the Schools and Functions, the University Anglican Chaplain, RUSU, Co-op, and in partnership with RISC.
- Subscription to the Ethical Consumption publication for use by all staff and students to inform ethical purchases and by the Careers team to inform student ethical employment opportunities.

iv. Looking Ahead to 2023/24

The Fairtrade Steering Group aims to work on the following activities in 2023/24.

- Coordinate Fairtrade events into in the <u>University Green Festival</u> in November 2023
- Coordinate more closely with the RUSU Fresher's Fair and Events team in 2023/24
- > Hold another event in partnership with the Chaplaincy and RISC in December 2023
- > Hold another Fairtrade Pancake Day event with the Anglican Chaplain in February 2024
- > Hold a physical event for staff, students, community during Fairtrade Fortnight in Feb/March 2024
- > Hold the residential event for PhD students in SMPCS in Spring/Summer 2024
- Discover more teaching and research opportunities at the University in 2023/24
- > Look further into how decolonisation of our curriculum integrates with Fairtrade aims in 23/24
- Look further into other certifications for different commodities e.g. BLap, BCorp, Soil Association, RSPCA Assured, Marine Stewardship Council (MSC), Aquaculture Stewardship Council (ASC), Vegan, Red Tractor, Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO)
- Tender in 23/24 for University Merchandise to include requirements for Fairtrade, ethically produced items.

Until next year, we remain committed the our Fairtrade activities and look forward to expanding them with our students, staff, community and partners!
