How will our trains be affected?

Saturday 16 September (between 0800 and 1400)

- Didcot Parkway to Reading No trains
- Bristol Temple Meads to London Paddington 1 train an hour calling at Bath Spa and Reading
- South Wales to London Paddington 1 train an hour, calling additionally at Chippenham
- Hereford/Worcester/Oxford to London Paddington -Trains will terminate at Didcot Parkway
- Cheltenham Spa to Swindon amended timetable

Saturday 16 September (after 1400) and all day Sunday 17 September

- Trains to/from the West of England will be diverted via Bristol Temple Meads but still run to London Paddington. Journey times will be extended by up to 70 minutes.
- South Wales to London Paddington Hourly service. Trains will be diverted but still run to London Paddington. Journey times will be extended by up to 90 minutes.
- Bristol Temple Meads to London Paddington -Reduced to 1 train per hour and terminate at Didcot Parkway
- Hereford/Worcester/Oxford to London Paddington -Trains will terminate at Didcot Parkway
- London Paddington Reading Trains will start/terminate at Maidenhead
- Services from Exeter St Davids (via Westbury) and Bedwyn/Newbury - Trains will terminate at Theale
- Cheltenham Spa to Swindon amended timetable



Summary of replacement buses

- Reading to Swindon (non-stop 70 minutes journey)
- Reading to Didcot Parkway (non-stop 40 minutes journey)
- Reading to Didcot Parkway (stopping bus*)
- Reading to Basingstoke (non-stop 40 minutes journey)
- Reading to Basingstoke (stopping bus*)
- Slough to Theale (non-stop 45 minutes journey)
- Maidenhead to Theale (via Reading 80 minutes journey)
- Maidenhead to Didcot Parkway (via Reading - 90 minutes journey)
- **Twyford to Henley-on-Thames** (25 minutes journey)
- * Stopping buses will call at stations on the route



CrossCountry trains

CrossCountry trains will run between the South Coast and Basingstoke. They will also run between Didcot Parkway and Birmingham (and the North).

A direct replacement bus between Winchester and Didcot Parkway will link these services.

Car parking

There will be reduced parking at Maidenhead, Shiplake, Theale and Twyford stations. Please allow plenty of time to park your car as space may be limited.

Intercity Express Trains are arriving this autumn

Our new Intercity Express Trains will start to be introduced this autumn giving you:

- more seats, tables and legroom
- improved air-conditioning
- improved passenger information and Wi-Fi

They will start to run between London, Bristol and South Wales, with other routes being introduced as more trains enter service.
