## Annex 2 - Contact hours incl. changes to field trips and experiential learning

# General principles:

- Learning outcomes should not be altered.
- Overall module contact hours must stay the same.
- Overall hours, which are not "independent study hours" shall broadly stay the same. There is some flexibility within these categories e.g. around lectures etc. see table below.
   However, the overriding principle is that there should not be anything other than minimal changes between types of contact hours, and only where this is necessitated by COVID-19.

#### We must notify students of changes to

- Fieldtrips and study trips
- External learning
- Work place learning

These changes will be collated and communicated to students as part of the process set out at point 1. Please do not send notification of changes to the above to students without first speaking to your Teaching and Learning Dean, who will also contact Legal Services.

## **Contact Hours:**

What is meant by 'contact hours'?

Contact time can come in a range of different forms, many of which are set out below, and may involve different teaching staff, for example a lecturer or visiting lecturer, liaison librarian, technician or support staff and employer (in the case of work-based learning). Contact time may be timetabled synchronous interactive sessions (either on campus or online) and may also be offered asynchronously online, for example online discussion forums, interactive group discussions or similar.
