## Feedback: Favour or Fever!

- Negative attitude towards comments
- Indicator of failure
- Critiçism
- Ego and confidence crises
- Feedback phobia
- Teachers think they are doing us favour
  - Actually! They are causing us fever!

## My story with Feedback (FB)



#### Strategies I use to deal with FB

- Remind myself that FB is a learning opportunity.
- Open the file in the morning in presence of my friends.
- Go through the comments with no action.
- Visit the file later and classify the comments.
- Seek clarifications from teacher or supervisor.
- Face the truth and start reacting.
- Take notes and keep a record.

## Plagiarism: Good or Evil!

- What you read is a model for what you write!
- Write as they write but do not write what they write!!!
- Avoid by any means!
- Means to avoid are still needed!
- International students' attitude towards plagiarism.
- Unavoidable chunky and cheesy language.
- Camouflage game.

## My story with Plagiarism (PGM)



#### Strategies I use to avoid plagiarism

- Remind myself: it's my own work.
- Remind myself: I can't swim without getting wet.
- Paraphrase is my interpretation or reflection on what I read, not re-wording of what I read.
- Know more about the topic (establish expertise).
- Consult more than one reference/author.
- Always take notes and acknowledge the sources.
- Avoid: CPC

#### Lessons Learned

- Do To Learn rather than Learn To Do.
- No gain without pain.
- "Being challenged in life is inevitable, failure is optional"\*
- Learn how to write is not a clear-cut process.
- Take advantage of plagiarism and criticism.
- Be reflected and establish know-how skills.
- Discover your own strategies.
